

Pastor Pitman also quoted from Ecclesiastes 9:5 "For the living know





Materials: a printer if you decide to use our caterpillar craft template (we will get to it in a little while), red or yellow paper for the head, green paper for the body, glue, scissors, optional (black marker and wiggle eye stickers if you decide to make this little creature freehand).




1. Print out caterpillar craft templates. Place a sheet of red and a sheet of green paper in the printer and print the file. This is naturally optional. This craft is amazingly cute if you just free hand it.



2. Cut the square shape out of green paper. Fold along the line (the small rectangle – if you look at the image below, the line is on the far right). Now cut along all the dashed lines. Cut, cut, cut.



3. Once all the strips are cut, fold them (along the non-dashed line). Make a crease and unfold all.

5 & Final Step: Cut the head shapes out of red (or yellow, or well any color really) paper. Cut antennae out of scrap green paper. Glue the head shapes on both sides of the "looped tunnel". Glue them together on the top. Your adorable little caterpillar craft is ready to wiggle on it's way! (see picture top left)
