A Story of Support and Generosity

On a beautiful spring Sabbath morning, Pen

Braister-Sturgis, the Arden Street Ministry leader, entered the foyer of the Arden Adventist Church and was surprised to see two men from her Sabbath School class wearing overalls. Upon asking them about it, she found out that Paul M. recently had surgery and had to wear loose-fitting clothes, so he purchased brand new overalls to attend church. When Richard H. heard about Paul's situation, he wanted to show his support by wearing similar clothes so Paul wouldn't stand out in the congregation.

As the Sabbath School began, another friend, Mike H, entered the room and asked about the overalls. Once Paul explained the medical reason for wearing them, and Richard's show of solidarity Mike sat down, but seemed to have something more to say about the subject. "I think it's a cool idea." Pen said to Mike. It's not every day that you see conservative men wear overalls to church." Mike then challenged Pen to persuade Pastor Eric to wear overalls for the entire church service, include the sermon, and promised to donate \$100 to the Arden Street Ministry.

Richard H. added to the challenge, offering to donate \$200 to the ministry if Pen could get Pastor Eric to wear overalls for the entire church service. Three hundred dollars would buy a lot

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of food for the homeless, so Pen approached Pastor to Eric and explained the situation. To her surprise, Pastor Eric agreed to wear overalls if more money was raised and spoke about the overalls challenge in the church announcements, encouraging the men in the church to participate and raise funds for the Arden Street Ministry. Over the next few weeks, Pastor Eric continued to bring up the overalls challenge in his announcements, reminding the congregation of the increasing food prices and the challenges faced by the ministry. On Fa-



ther's Day, the overalls Sabbath, Pen was shocked to see the number of church members who participated, including Pastor Eric himself. During the announcements, Pastor Eric revealed that the challenge had raised more than \$7,400 for the Arden Street Ministry. Pen was thankful for a God who used a surgery and a pair of overalls to raise funds for a homeless ministry and for a church family that was supportive of those in need. She found herself wishing that the overalls challenge could become a yearly event at the Arden Adventist Church. — Pen Braister-Sturgis -

Thompson Ave. Clanton, AL on April 30, 2023 from 2 to 5PM.

Truth being said we, as church family, are very blessed in so many areas and in turn is our privilege to share these blessings with those around us. Not only we have a good number of health professionals, but we do have a great health message to share. We did talk about some of them in the previous newsletters. Then in a special and more detailed way though the Spirit of Prophecy. We will also like to involve some other local vendors that will provide more services to the community – it is still a work in progress in this area.

Pretty soon the flyers and marketing material will be available. However in the mean time will like to solicit that you will keep us in your prayers as we get ready, for the event, end especially for our precious guests that will visit our stations.

Personally I am very excited, if you did not realize it yet. I do know God has great plans not only with our lives, but especially with the lives of the people we are about to encounter at these events. I know God can use us if we are willing. In addition we ourselves will be blessed by this experience, of this I am very sure. After looking over my sightless husband's chart, the doctor entered the room. He looked at Him closely, introduced himself, then with a puzzled look he said "You don't look like a person Who's ready for hospice." That shocked me. He proceeded to ask him a series of questions. Then he said he would like to take a few CT Scans of his brain to see if there was something He could do.

You see, my husband was rushed by ambulance to Surgery ICU. After looking at his X-rays the neurosurgeon on duty came into his room and said there was no way he could operate, because of his age and other medical issues. He showed no empathy. I left the room crying, wondering what are we going to do. I said to my son, "He can't live this way!" My son comforting me said, "It'll be okey, we just have to trust God." My husband stayed in SICU 3 days, then was transferred to the Neuro floor. I was anxious, tired and confused. All along God had a plan.

Then came the this Angel into our midst. He said "I just can't leave your husband like this, when I believe I can help him. After he looked at the CT scans, he showed them to me on his cellphone, explain what he saw and what he could do. I asked if he would explain it to our children. He talked to our boys. They understood and agreed to the surgery. As the surgeon started preparation for the surgery, he kept telling me "you got to have faith". Who is this man? Where did he come from? The surgeon and I shared several scriptures and talked about the love of God. He was constantly encouraging my faith. The surgery went well. The neurosurgeon was pleased with his recovery. Before coming home, he spent 2 weeks in rehab. We spent a total of 25 days in the hospital. When we left the hospital , we had an assortment of medical equipment which was only used for several days.

With a thankful heart, I'm looking at my husband of 53 years smiling, basking in his remarkable recovery knowing that against all odds God has been our rock, our healer and doctor. Permission to Rest

God had finished the work . . . so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. Genesis 2:2

We sat atop some beach boulders, my friend Soozi and I, watching the foam send up sea spray in arched curls. Looking at the incoming waves crashing one after another against the rocks, Soozi announced, "I love the ocean. It keeps moving so I don't have to!"



Isn't it interesting how some of us feel we need "permission" to pause from our work to rest? Well, that's just what our good God offers us! For six days, God spun the earth into existence, creating light, land, vegetation, animals, and humans. Then on the seventh day, He rested (Genesis 1:31–2:2). In the Ten Commandments, God listed His rules for healthy living to honor Him (Exodus 20:3–17), including the command to remember the Sabbath as a day of rest (vv. 8–11). In the New Testament, we see Jesus healing all the sick of the town (Mark 1:29–34) and then early the next morning retreating to a solitary place to pray (v. 35). Purposefully, our God both worked and rested.

The rhythm of God's provision in work and His invitation to rest reverberates around us. Spring's planting yields growth in summer, harvest in autumn, and rest in winter. Morning, noon, afternoon, evening, night. God orders our lives for both work and rest, offering us permission to do both.

Zucchini-Carrot Casserole:

2 lbs. squash (zucchini) - Cook in salted water 5 min., drain well.

1/2 cup chopped onion, 1 can of celery soup or cashews gravy, 1 cup soy vegenaise or sour cream (Tofutti), 1 cup shredded carrots.

Combine above ingredients and add to zucchini: 2 tbs melted margarine, 1 8oz pkg. stuffing mix (or 3 cups wheat bread crumbs plus



1 tsp. sage and 1/2 tsp. basil). Put 1/2 stuffing mix in the bottom of the casserole. Add all the zucchini mixture, cover with the rest of the stuffing mix. Bake for 30 min at 350 degrees. (If you like yellow squash better, it will work very well, too. Enjoy! Bom Apetite! Mirtes Schmeling
