"When, in the midst of his blind error and prejudice, Saul was given a revelation of the Christ whom he was persecuting, he was placed in direct communication with the church, which is the light of the world. In this case Ananias represents Christ, and also represents Christ's ministers upon the earth, who are appointed to act in His stead. In Christ's stead Ananias touches the eyes of Saul, that they may receive sight. In Christ's stead he places his hands upon him, and, as he prays in Christ's name, Saul receives the Holy Ghost. All is done in the name and by the authority of Christ. Christ is the fountain; the church is the channel of communication." AA122

In the end we all have the same experience as Saul of Tarsus. We are brought to Christ through the church. Ananias, the representative of ministers of the gospel today, still reach out to souls today. But it is not just ministers who have charge of this work. Paul himself talks about this in his letter to the Ephesian church. "And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds [a] and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ" Eph. 4:11-13

"The Redeemer of the world does not sanction experience and exercise in religious matters independent of his organized and acknowledged church. Many have an idea that they are responsible to Christ alone for their light and experience, independent of his recognized followers on earth." *Sketches From the Life of Paul*, p. 31 So we all have a part to play. And it is through the church that we learn how to do it.

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One day, one friend asked another, "How is it that you are always so happy? You have so much energy, and you never seem to get down."



Layered Enchilada Casserole

- 1 can Loma Linda burger
- ½ chopped onion
- 1 teaspoon salt (optional)
- 1/4 teaspoon Cayenne pepper
- 1 Tablespoon chili powder
- ½ teaspoon cumin
- 1 can (4 oz) chopped ripe olives
- 1 can (8 oz) tomato sauce
- 1 can (4 oz) chopped chili peppers
- 6 flour tortillas
- 8 oz. grated Vegie Cheese
- ½ cup water

Put burger In a large skillet and cook a little. Stir in salt, pepper, cumin, olives, tomato sauce, and chili peppers.

Bring to a boil.

In a greased $2\frac{1}{2}$ quart round casserole, place alternate layers of tortillas and burger mixture and shredded cheese lightly buttered, ending with cheese sprinkled over top.

Add water and cover with lid or foil. Bake at 400 degrees for 30 minutes.

Garnish with ripe olives, chopped green onions and fresh chopped tomatoes.
